DEDICATION OF A NEW WAR MEMORIAL

To commemorate the centenary of World War One, Whittingham Parish Council, assisted by war veteran Gerard Rogerson, will be unveiling a stone memorial in memory of the residents of Whittingham Parish who served in any way in the Great War of 1914 -1918.

The memorial will be located at Beacon Drive and a Dedication Service will be held **10.45 - 11.00** on Friday **11th of November**. All residents are welcome to attend. Please contact the Clerk for further details.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (abbreviated to CIL) is a planning fee that applicants pay to Preston City Council for most new dwellings and developments, which create additional floor space of 100 square metres or more. The City Council is required to pass a proportion of the planning fee to the Parish Council on the understanding the fee will be used to improve local services or infrastructure **as a direct result of the new development or increased population.**

The Parish Council would like residents to be involved in putting forward suggestions for what the money could be spent on locally. Suggestions from the Parish Council include increased bus services, support for the police to continue to operate out of Goosnargh Village Hall, Solar Powered Speed Indicator signs, improved footpath between Goosnargh Village Hall and Goosnargh play area and additional dog / litter bins.

Please complete the form inside this newsletter to let us know your views both on the suggestions by the Parish Council and to add any additional ideas you may have.
