#### NO COLD CALLING

Acting on concerns from residents, the Parish Council has asked Lancashire County Council to consider making parts of the Parish a No Cold Calling Area. (NCCA) If the request is approved, signs will be erected on lamp posts advising that cold callers are not welcome. It is not a criminal offence to cold call in a NCCA, but Lancashire hopefully cold callers will be discouraged in areas where the signs are displayed.



In order to erect the signs, a consultation will be issued to residents and 50% of those consulted must reply in favour. Please look out for a consultation form towards the end of November. As not all areas can be included in the NCCA, we have a limited supply of No Cold Calling stickers which can be displayed on your front door or window. These are available from

#### WHITTINGHAM PARK DEVELOPMENT

Recently, Lancashire County Council consulted the Parish Council on a proposed expansion of Goosnargh Oliverson's School. As part of the consultation detail, it was confirmed that the plans for a **new** primary school at Whittingham Park are still going ahead. We will know more details once the planning application is submitted.

A ground breaking ceremony was recently held in Guild Park to mark the commencement of Water Meadow View - a 14 bed specialist NHS mental health inpatient facility for adults with a learning disability. The Parish Council is still progressing its plans to bring St John's Church back in to community use and we hope to work closely with the NHS to ensure patients and visitors are well catered for.

Planning approval was recently granted for the new Sports and Social Club and the Parish Council understands that tenders are being submitted to commence the building work. We wish them every success in providing the new facility.

### **LOCAL PLAN**

Preston City Council are in the process of refreshing the Local Plan which dictates when and where new homes will be built. The Parish Council continues to monitor progress on the Local Plan and will ensure that residents are kept informed of any proposed changes affecting Whittingham.
