The Parish Council also resolved to donate £1,000 each towards the provision of a new play area at Goosnargh and at Cumeragh Village. We are grateful for the support of local community groups as neither of these projects would have gone ahead without their support.

Following receipt of the new Community Infrastructure Levy Councillors are currently considering improvements to the pavement between Goosnargh play area and Goosnargh Village Hall and are also considering the provision of more litter / dog bins across the parish. CONCERNS ABOUT CONSTRUCTION WORK

Planning applications are submitted to the City Council who consult the Parish Council and County Council before deciding whether or not to grant planning permission. If the application is approved, the developer must submit a Construction and Environmental Method Plan to the City Council. This document contains information on when sites may open, arrangements for the parking of contractors vehicles, wheel washing facilities etc.

Construction concerns should be reported to the site manager but if the problems are not resolved, residents can report concerns to the City Council enforcement section **01772 906 912**.

WHITTINGHAM HOSPITAL UPDATE

Residents may be aware that there is a legal document attached to the Whittingham Hospital development which requires the developer to improve and provide leisure facilities, travel services, artwork and allotments as the site enters various phases of development.

Leisure facilities have been well provided for by the Sports and Social Club and the Parish Council is working closely with them and the Homes and Communities Agency to ensure that the existing provision is retained and enhanced in keeping with the needs and demands of the area. Consultants are being used to assess the needs and current provision and their report is expected in April.

The Parish Council is also attempting to ensure that allotments are provided and has requested that the commissioned artwork reflects the life and work of those associated with the former hospital.

WHAT IS A PARISH COUNCIL?

A Parish Council is the most local level of the local authority structure and it plays an essential role in ensuring that the City and County Councils are aware of local views when making decisions affecting the area. Parish Councils are funded by local residents through council tax payments and since last year, they also receive income called a Community Infrastructure Levy which can be spent on infrastructure improvements to help meet the demands of new development.

COUNCILLOR VACANCY

Whittingham is represented by 7 Parish Councillors - local people who want to work together voluntarily to improve the local area. Currently there is a vacancy on the Council. Whittingham Parish Council meets regularly at 7.00pm on the 2nd Monday of the month at Goosnargh Village Hall.
