REDUCTION IN HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE

Residents may be aware that the County Council has decided to cut the standard of highway maintenance so that

- Grass verges in the rural area will only be cut once a year
- Grass verges in the rest of the City will be cut five times a year
- Weed control will be targeted based on complaints

We have not been advised how leaf clearance will be dealt with in the autumn but it is anticipated that these will not be removed as frequently. All complaints relating to any of the above listed items including the cutting of hedges adjacent to the highway should be directed to Lancashire County Council in the following ways;

PLANNING POLICY

Despite the City Council allocating additional land for housing, homes are not being built as quickly as envisaged and a Planning Inspector has recently ruled that the City Council does not have a 5 year housing supply. This means that the City Council is under increasing pressure to allow planning applications in the open countryside which would previously have been refused. The Parish Council is monitoring the situation closely and remains opposed to new developments in the open countryside particularly when the site is considered unsustainable.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

New developments at Whittingham Hospital and Cromwell Heights were approved on the understanding that the developers would increase the bus service provision. The Parish Council is aware of the pledges that were made to secure planning permission and is liaising with the developers and County Council to ensure frequent bus services are provided.

WHITTINGHAM HOSPITAL FACILITIES

In our last Newsletter we reported that the Parish Council is working closely with the Sports and Social Club and the Homes and Communities Agency to ensure that the existing leisure provision is retained and enhanced in keeping with the needs and demands of the expanding area. Consultants have produced several options regarding the configuration of the facilities and the Parish Council has made representation that the facilities should be located in the heart of the development.

STREET NAMES

Following several queries about the naming of the roads at the Whittingham Hospital site, we can inform you that **Henry Littler Way** is named after the architect who designed the original hospital buildings. **Palmour Road** is named after Walter Thomas Palmour who was the reverend of St John's Church and **Tattersall Road** and **Joyce Roads** are named after two privates who passed away at the hospital when it was commandeered for the treatment of war casualties. Other roads have been named after former buildings such as St Johns Drive, Cameron Avenue and West Lodge Road.
